<p>GFMC Tool 1 – Global Wildland Fire Information System Objective: Global online repository on fire management information with associated offer to provide services in policy advising, formulation and high-level political activities</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 2 – Regional Wildland Fire Networks under the aegis of the Global Wildland Fire Network Objective: Sharing of knowledge, expertise and resources in fire management at regional and global level</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 3 – International and regional advisory bodies / services for fire management Objective: The GFMC and the Global Wildland Fire Network are offering thematic support to these international bodies for devising, designing and implementing fire management programmes.</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 4 – Global Wildland Fire Early Warning System and global portal for national and regional wildland fire early warning Objective: Provision of wildfire early warning by global, regional and national fire danger rating and forecast systems</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 5 – International support tools / services for wildfire emergency response Objective: Offer for assistance by the GFMC under the aegis of the UN or independently to countries lacking capacities in wildfire preparedness and during wildfire emergencies.</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 6 – Establishment and services of Regional Fire Management Resource Centers Objective: Regional centers of excellence are designed to support the countries in the region at the science-policy interface, capacity building and advisory support.</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 7 – National Round Tables on Fire Management Objective: Planning instrument for fire management at national level</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 8 – Systematic application of outreach work in participatory (community-based) fire management Objective: Sharing of expertise in participatory (community-based or integrated) fire management approaches to countries globally</p>
<p>GFMC Tool 9 – Capacity building in the application of principles of integrated fire management in biodiversity management, nature conservation and protected areas management Objective: Enabling forest and land management agencies, policy makers and custodians of protected areas to utilize natural fire and apply prescribed fire in ecosystem management</p>
