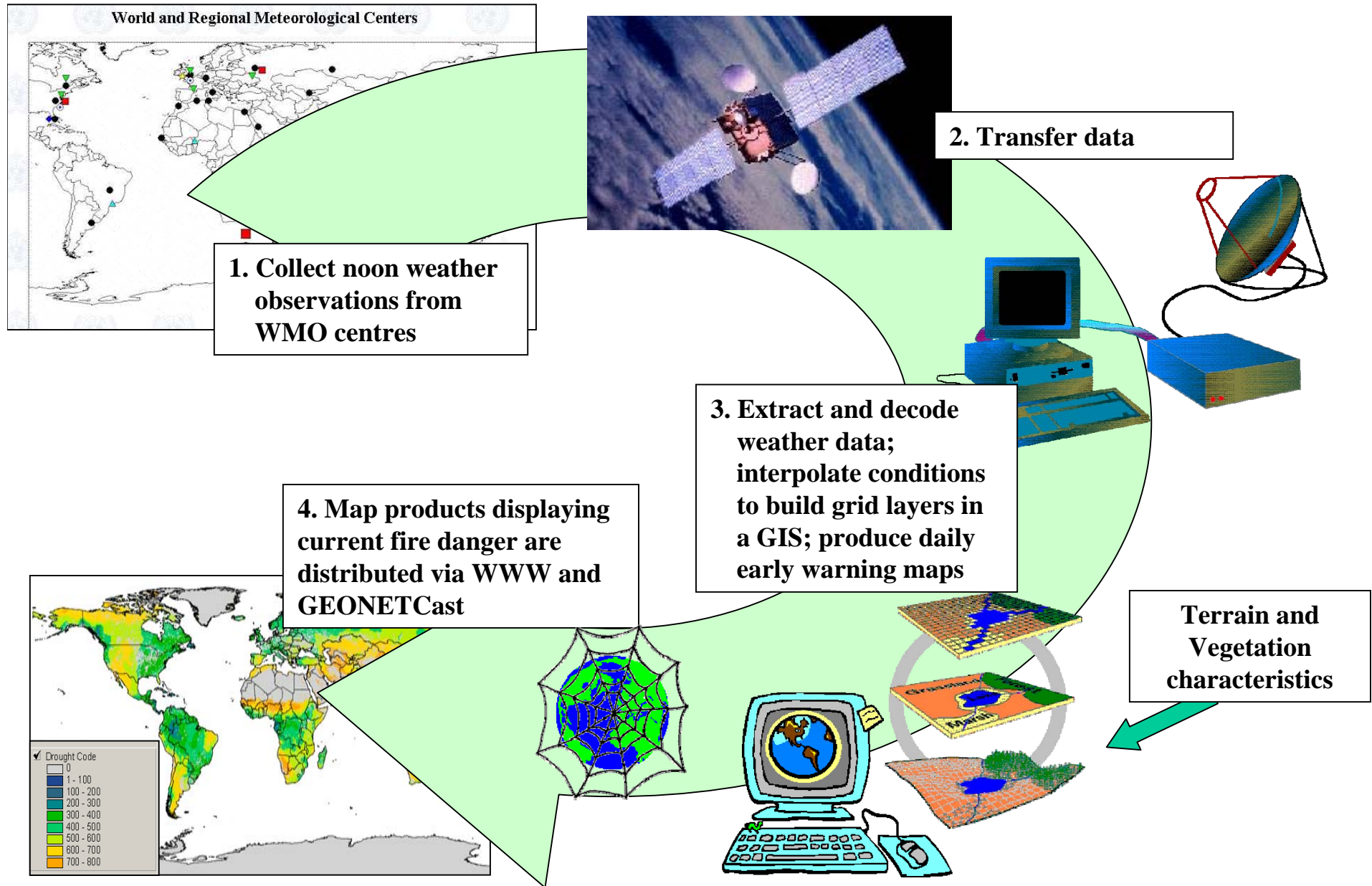

Fire Danger maps

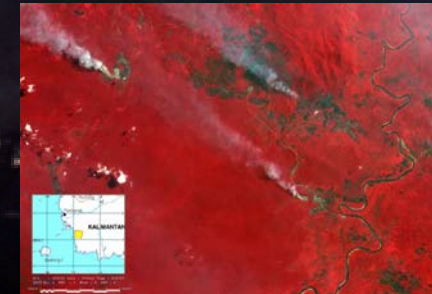
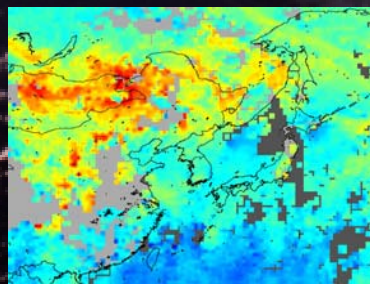
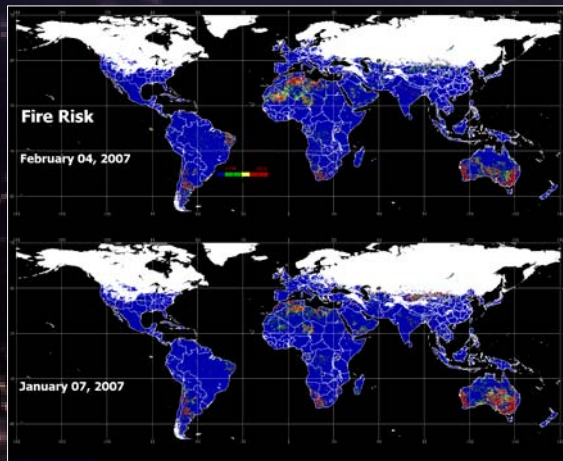
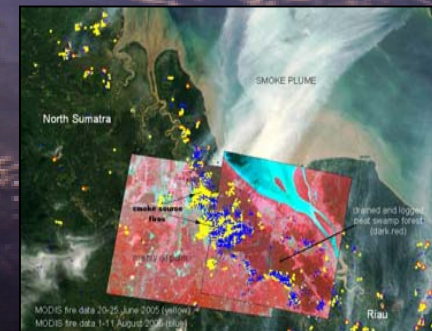
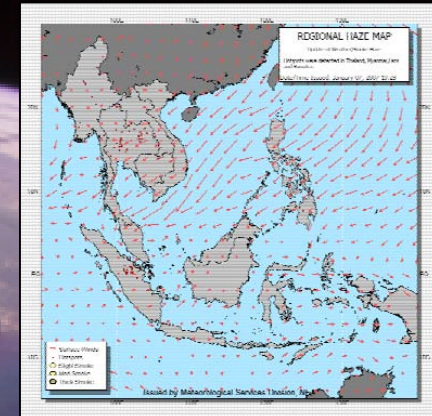
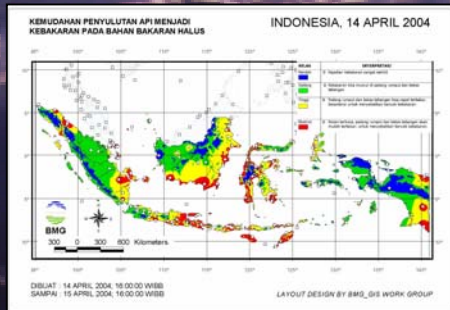
Typical data flow
